

# 5. People in Cardiff achieve their full potential


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
# 5.1.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree that people in Cardiff have access to opportunities that help them achieve their full potential?

More than half 55.9% of respondents agreed that people in Cardiff have access to opportunities to help them achieve their full potential.

Agreement with this statement rose to 60.6% in Cardiff North compared to 48.3% in Cardiff East. No significant difference could be found between demographic groups.




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# **5.2** Volunteering

#### 5.2.1 Do you currently volunteer in Cardiff?

More than one in five respondents reported that they already volunteer in some capacity. Those most likely to be involved in volunteering activities were respondents without full time employment (28.0%). More than a quarter (26.7%) of respondents aged 55+ reported to also volunteer compared to just 18.0% of those aged under 35.



646 of the current volunteers gave details of their work with over a quarter involved with a 'Charity' (28.3%) ahead of 'Environmental' (16.3%), 'Community Group' (13.6%) and 'Church' (11.9%).








#### 5.2.2 How aware are you of how to access voluntary opportunities in the city?

Just 43.5% of respondents felt aware of how to access voluntary opportunities in the city.





# 5.2.3 If you wanted to volunteer in Cardiff how would you want to find out information and access opportunities?

Almost three-fifths of respondents would look to access volunteering information and opportunities through a 'Single website' (59.8%). This was almost double the alternatives as 29.8% would access opportunities 'Via a Community Hub/Library', 29.7% by 'Email' and 29.0% by contacting 'Cardiff Voluntary Council'.

Of the 113 open comments the largest proportion related to using the 'Internet' to find information and access volunteering opportunities (42.5%). 14.2% would 'Contact the organisation directly' with 9.7% using 'Social media' to find information and opportunities.






#### 5.2.4 Are you aware of the following services?

Less than a quarter of respondents were aware of either the 'Volunteering in Wales' website (24.3%) or the 'Cardiff Voluntary Council' (22.8%).







## 5.3 Provision of Welsh Language Adult Community Learning

Cardiff Council's Adult Community Learning team offer a range of adult education courses including both Welsh language courses for learners and a range of other courses delivered through the medium of Welsh.

Ask Cardiff 2016 included a Welsh language question which should be considered alongside the results. Of the 3,541 respondents 55.0% had no Welsh language skills. Of the remainder 14.0% were a Welsh language 'Learner' with the remainder classed as 'Basic. (16.4%), 'Moderate' (6.3%) or 'Fluent' (8.3%).





# 5.3.1 Are you, or have you previously been enrolled on a course with Adult Community Learning in the last three years?

Eighty-two (2.7%) of those responding to the consultation were a 'Current learner' on an adult community learning course whilst a further 387 (12.7%) had been enrolled on a course in the previous three years.



#### 5.3.2 If current/previous learner, was your course taught in the Welsh language?

Almost a fifth (18.8%) of current and previous learners reported that their course was taught in the Welsh language.




#### 5.3.3 What Adult Community Learning Course would you like to be delivered in Welsh?

Of the 717 respondents who participated in this open question 63.5% were not interested in learning a course in Welsh. This high figure can be linked to the fact that 55.0% of respondents had no Welsh language skills.

Of those who suggested courses to be delivered 13.0% listed 'Welsh' language courses, significantly ahead of other 'Languages' (2.2%), 'Welsh culture/history' and 'Arts and crafts' (both 2.0%). A further 11.0% felt that Welsh language courses should be delivered 'Anywhere there is a demand' (11.0%).






# 5.3.4 Do you have any other feedback on the potential for Adult Community Learning Courses being offered in Welsh?

There were 322 responses to this question with almost half of the respondents suggesting that the Council should 'Stop spending money on Welsh' (48.1%), and another 19.9% feeling that Welsh language courses should be delivered 'Only if demand can justify cost'. However 18.9% felt that courses 'Should be widely available' with another 7.1% sharing 'Barriers' to accessing courses.




#### 5.3.5 To what extent do you agree that Cardiff is a fair, just and inclusive society?

Almost two thirds of respondents agreed that Cardiff is a fair, just and inclusive society (75.5%), including 12.0% who strongly agreed with the statement. Under a tenth of respondents either tended to disagree or disagreed strongly (8.9%).

Looking at the results across the Neighbourhood Partnership Areas there was little variation between Cardiff West where the highest proportion agreed with the statement (77.8%), and Cardiff South West where support was lowest (72.6%). In addition, 82.6% of respondents under 35 felt that Cardiff is a fair, just and inclusive society compared to 65.4% of respondents who identified as having a disability.
