### PILOT USERS NEEDED!!! - BRAND NEW CARDIFF APP.



Cardiff Council is creating a mobile app to provide a more convenient way for people to report issues, request information, and to pay for and order services.

Testing of the Cardiff Gov App will allow users to report fly tipping, view waste collection calendars, set reminders for waste collections, view Council tax balance and payment history, set-up and amend Council tax direct debits and make a Council tax payment.

The mobile app is available to download on both iOS and Android platforms. We are looking for citizens to help test the functionality of the mobile app prior to release, and provide feedback via a Citizens panel online survey.

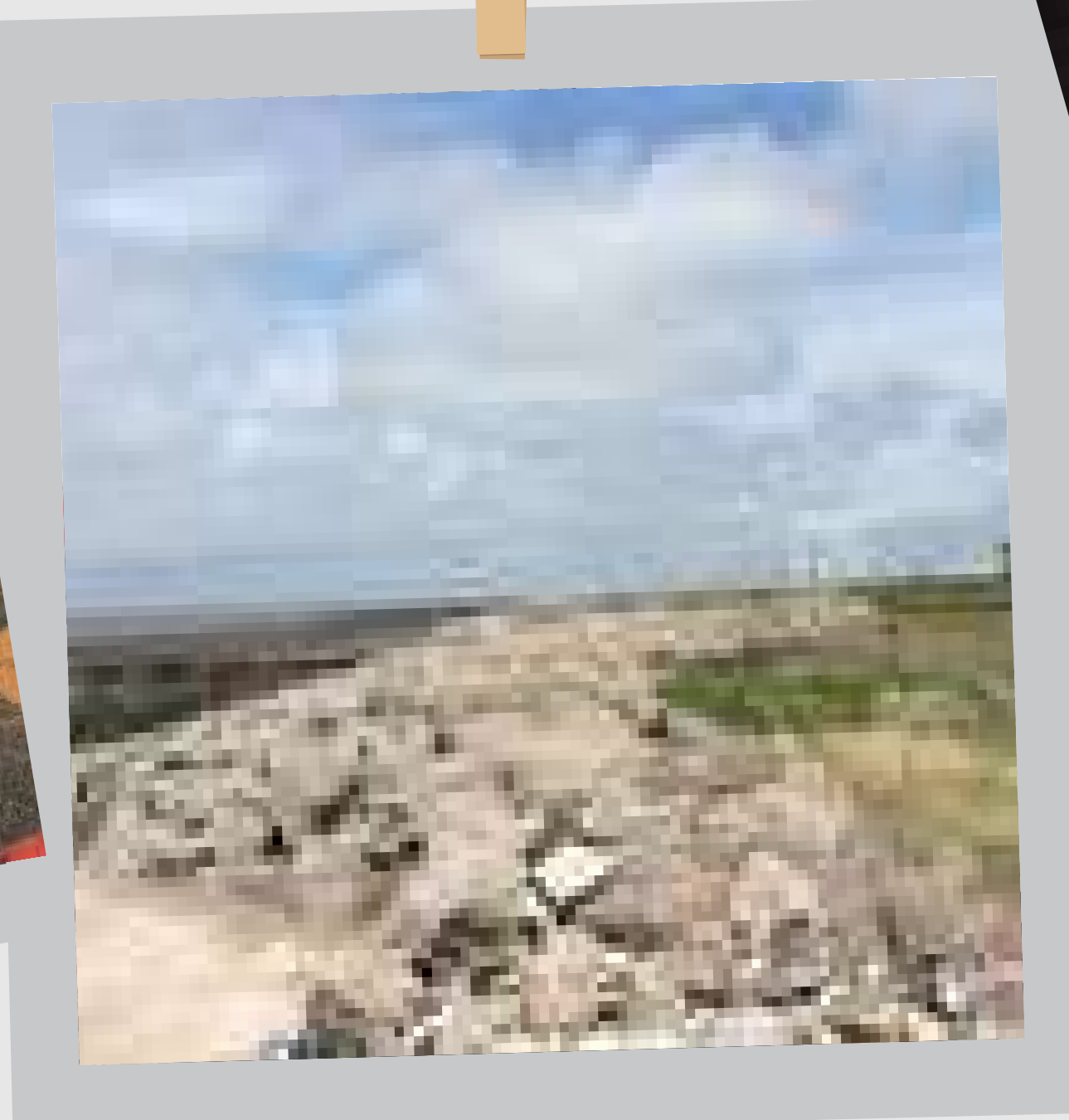

# THE DIFFERENCE YOU HAVE HELPED TO MAKE



## IMPROVED CHILDREN'S PLAY AREAS

37.6% of all respondents in our Ask Cardiff Survey 2016 when rated their level of satisfaction with children's play areas as eight or more.

In March 2018 work to create a brand new play facility for children in Llanedeyrn was completed. A new area featuring top-of-the-range play equipment for children aged five to 10-years-old has been installed at Coed-y-Gores, following investment via Cardiff Council's Neighbourhood Renewal schemes programme.

## TACKLE THE THREAT OF GLOBAL WARMING

Over three quarters (77.1%) of Ask Cardiff 2017 respondents were concerned about Climate Change.

In March 2018 A new £11m coastal defence scheme designed to help protect east Cardiff from flooding has been discussed by the Council's Cabinet. The Council has agreed to tender for a design and build contract for the coastal defence scheme.

## LED LIGHTING

In our Ask Cardiff 2016, one in four (24.3%) respondents reported feeling 'Very Safe' walking in their neighbourhood after dark.

13,600 lanterns have been replaced on main transport routes in the city (Principle Routes). We are currently piloting LED lights in Radyr.

The new lights have a better visual presence on our streets, revealing obstacles for pedestrians and cyclists more clearly, reducing street crime and develop safer routes to our schools.

# PUBLIC ATTITUDES TO LOW EMISSION VEHICLES



We would like to understand public interest in low emission vehicles and the demand for charge points in public areas. This short questionnaire will support the development of transport infrastructure in the future. We would appreciate your time to answer a few questions on this topic. All the information you provide will be held anonymously and securely and you can choose to omit any questions that you do not feel you want to answer.

Low emission vehicles emit fewer pollutants than petrol or diesel vehicles, and can help to improve air quality and reduce noise in our urban areas. For the purpose of this questionnaire, a low emission vehicle is classed as an electric or plug-in hybrid car or van.

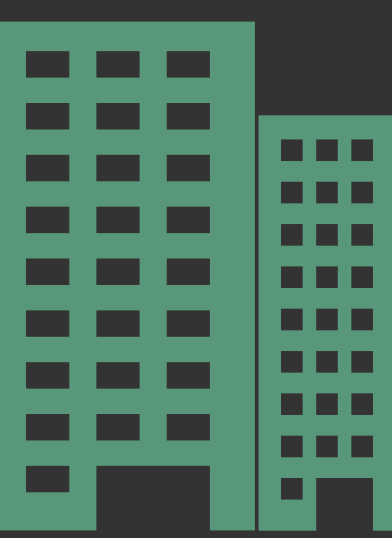
