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Introduction

Our Junior Steps programme offers KS2 Primary School children fantastic learning and development opportunities in a range of exciting subjects.

The programme aims to encourage, engage and support pupils as they learn and develop new skills and experiences throughout the course.

Sessions are held one day a week at a number of different venues across the city for the duration of the school year. The programme also covers literacy and numeracy, life skills / PSE workshops as well as a practical subject of the student's choice.

Our structured programme offers courses in Land and Water Adventurous Activities, Playwork, Animal Care and Music and Movement. Courses are flexible and are based at different venues across the city such as Cardiff International White Water Centre, Cardiff Riding School, Splott Play Centre and Butetown Hub.

Land and Water Adventurous Activities

The program gives children the chance to experience new and exciting sports and activities, challenging them both mentally and physically. It helps to improve a child's personal and social development through team exercises and the importance of leading a healthy lifestyle.

Through sports and activities, children will develop and build on physical skills such as balance, control, running, throwing and catching. They will also learn how to communicate and work effectively with their peers through teambuilding exercises and games, which will help develop strong relationships and social skills.

Course benefits and outcomes:

- Develop pupils understanding in a variety of land and water based adventurous activities.
- Take part in problem solving or survival activities requiring pupils to plan collaboratively in pairs or small groups.
- Selecting and applying skills.

- Develop pupil's problem solving skills in a variety of situations in adventurous activities.
- Enable pupils to plan and work successfully as individuals, in pairs and in groups.
- Develop pupils understanding of the importance and significance of rules and safety.

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Playwork

Play is critical to brain development. Children will gain all the skills they need physically, mentally, cognitively, socially, emotionally and creatively through play. Playing with others helps children with negotiating group dynamics, collaboration skills, turn taking, understanding how and when to compromise.

Our play sessions will also include activities to support sensory, active, creative, role and fantasy play, such as cooking, arts & crafts and physical games. Supporting children to try new things, develop new skills, whilst using their imagination and creativity.

- Build self-esteem.
- Using their imagination.
- Forming friendships and developing social skills.
- Problem solving.
- Strengthening physical skills: co-ordination, balance and motor skills.
- Developing language and reading skills.

Animal Care

Animals can offer an extraordinary amount of emotional support. The horses at the Cardiff Riding School are used in a therapeutic setting to help children navigate challenging emotional experiences. The children will engage in activities such as grooming, feeding, and leading a horse while being supervised by a professional. The aim of this program is to help children develop skills such as emotional regulation, self-confidence, and responsibility.

The Animal Care program benefits a wide range of children, including those with behavioural challenges, mental health problems and learning difficulties. It helps to improve mental and physical wellbeing and social skills. It is also beneficial for anyone looking for a new way to improve confidence and self-awareness, or for a relaxing break from routine.

Course benefits and outcomes:

- Learning to care for horses and ponies.
- Learning basic horse management techniques.
- Perform daily checks on horses for health conditions.

- Build friendships.
- Build a trusting partnership between horse and human.
- Develop team work and leadership skills.
- Opportunities to ride horses.

Music and Movement

Performing arts engages the body, the mind and emotions. The music and movement program is inspiring, fun and energetic. The program can improve pupil's mental health and well-being whilst supporting children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.

How will we use your data?

Vocational education Cardiff collects your data so that we can:

- Process your order and manage your account.
- Email you with student progress and achievements.
- Monitor student progress
- Daily attendance reporting

If you agree, Vocational education Cardiff will share your data with our partner companies so that they may offer you their products and services – should you wish to withdraw your consent you would need to contact those companies directly.

We will be sharing daily attendance and student progress with schools.

How do we store your data?

Vocational education Cardiff securely stores your data at AWS DynamoDB database all Data transfer is TLS encryption. All data transfer is logged.

What data do we collect?

Vocational education Cardiff collects the following data:

- Personal identification information Name, email address, phone number, medical information
- Parental consent
- Additional learning needs and support
- Free School meal entitlement
- Daily attendance
- Qualifications

This is collected for the purpose of supporting tutors delivering our programs. Data Protection Law describes the legal basis for our processing of your data as necessary for the performance of a public task under the Education Act 1996.

How do we collect your data?

You directly provide Vocational education Cardiff with most of the data we collect. We collect data and process data when you:

- Register online or place an order for any of our products or services.
- Voluntarily complete a customer survey or provide feedback on any of our message boards or via email.
- Use or view our website via your browser's cookies.

• School referral form

Vocational Education Cardiff may also receive your data indirectly from the following sources:

• Referring school or agency

Vocational Education Cardiff will keep your referral form, attendance and course attainment for 12 months. Once this time period has expired, we will delete your data by removing the data from our database – In the event of a learner having an accident whist on roll, consent forms will be kept for 6 years.

What are your data protection rights?

Vocational education Cardiff would like to make sure you are fully aware of all of your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

The right to access – You have the right to request Vocational Education Cardiff for copies of your personal data.

The right to rectification – You have the right to request that Vocational Education Cardiff correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request Our Company to complete the information you believe is incomplete.

The right to erasure – You have the right to request that Vocational Education Cardiff erase your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to restrict processing – You have the right to request that Vocational Education Cardiff restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to object to processing – You have the right to object to Vocational Education Cardiff processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to data portability – You have the right to request that Vocational Education Cardiff transfer the data that we have collected to another organization, or directly to you, under certain conditions.
